REDS & PINKS



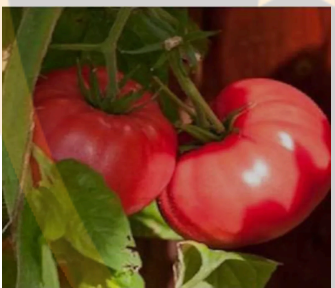
Beefsteak - Heirloom, Indeterminate. Gorgeous red tomato, up to 2-lb. fruits with a meaty texture and a full, rich flavor. They're ideal for slicing and eating fresh or for sandwiches. The vines can grow up to 8 ft. tall and staking is recommended. Disease Resistant. **75 DAYS.**



Bella Rosa - Hybrid, Determinate. Excellent disease resistance for hot climates. Resistant to Tomato Spotted Wilt Virus. It will perform better in heat than most varieties and will continue to set fruit once the heart of summer kicks in. Fruits are large, round and firm with exceptional flavor. **70 DAYS.**



Bloody Butcher - Heirloom, Indeterminate. This tomato is a popular variety known for its rich flavor and deep red, golf ball size fruits that ripen early in the season. This variety is high-yielding and can thrive in cooler conditions, making it suitable for both indoor and outdoor growing. **54 DAYS.**



Brandywine Sudduth - Heirloom, Indeterminate. These potato-leaved plants produce large (fourteen to thirty-six ounce) fruits that are oblate in shape and pink in color. Excellent flavor. **80 DAYS.**



Bush Beefsteak - Heirloom, Indeterminate. This tomato is a popular variety known for its rich flavor and deep red, golf ball size fruits that ripen early in the season. This variety is high-yielding and can thrive in cooler conditions **62 DAYS.**

REDS & PINKS (cont.)



Bush Champion II - Open-Pollinated, Determinate. One of the best varieties for growing in large containers on patios and decks! Growing to 24 inches tall, which makes it ideal for gardeners that have limited space. Tomatoes are perfect for salads and sandwiches. **65 DAYS.**



Bush Goliath - Open-Pollinated, Determinate. These tomatoes have a classic beefsteak shape and flavor with firm, light red fruit with few seeds. The vines grow up to 3 ½ ft., perfect for large patio containers. **68 DAYS.**



Champion II - Indeterminate. A step up from the original Champion, Champion II has the same flavor with much-improved disease resistance. This variety is a garden favorite. Use them for slicing on sandwiches and burgers or in salads. **62 DAYS.**



Delicious - Heirloom, Indeterminate. An American favorite slicing tomato. 1-2 lb meaty beefsteaks with rich old-fashioned tomato flavors. Fairly crack resistant with solid interiors. **85 DAYS.**



Dona - Heirloom, Indeterminate. Slightly flattened, almost seedless round tomato with a nice balance of sweet and acid. Good disease resistance. **75 DAYS.**

REDS & PINKS (cont.)



Fourth of July - Heirloom, Indeterminate. This variety is known for its vibrant red color and sweet flavor. Typically smaller than other varieties, with a diameter of about 2-3 inches. **62 DAYS.**



Ispolin - Heirloom, Indeterminate. Meaning giant in Russian, one of the biggest Russian heirloom tomatoes. Large red slightly ribbed fruit, 1-2 lb, up to 4", excellent sandwich slicer. Vigorous 8' ft. vine, heavy producer. Beautiful pink bottoms, end with yellow shoulders. **72 DAYS.**



Momotaro - Indeterminate. A Japanese hybrid that produces gorgeous dark pink, crack resistant, 7 oz fruits that are deeply oblated and have an exceptional sweet, delicious flavor. Prolific, heat tolerant, vines produce early yields of 6 to 7 fruit clusters throughout the season. **70 DAYS.**



Poseidon - Indeterminate. Smooth, unblemished pink fruit that weigh about 8 ozs. each with a delicious, mild flavor and low acid. **. 78 DAYS.**



Sasha's Altai - Heirloom, Determinate. A hearty tomato plant that produces very good yields of 4-6 oz., thinned-skinned, bright-red, slightly flattened, round tomatoes with complex flavor. Fruit sets well in cooler coastal climates and high altitudes. Excellent for canning, salads and making tomato juice. **72 DAYS.**

REDS & PINKS (cont.)



Silvery Fir Tree - Heirloom, Determinate. A dwarf Russian variety famous for its unique, small delicate foliage and steady production of rich, medium sized scarlet red fruit between 2-3". A bush that grows to about 2 ft. high. **54 DAYS**



Stupice - Heirloom, Indeterminate. A popular, vigorous plant which yields abundant, early 3 to 6 ounce red fruit. Its good, potato-leaf foliage results in high quality, round, crimson fruit. This Czechoslovakian-bred vine has exceptional flavor and ripens very early. **60-65 DAYS.**



Super Sioux - Open-Pollinated, Indeterminate — Thick walled and fleshy with a nice old-time tart flavor. 'Super Sioux' is a good choice for hot, dry locations and it sets fruit well in higher temperatures. A good processing tomato for home gardening and early fresh market sales. **70 DAYS.**



Sweet Charlotte - Determinate. Perfect for a sandwich, in salads, or just sliced. High yield potential, with attractive 8-10 oz fruit, with wonderful flavor. **72 DAYS.**

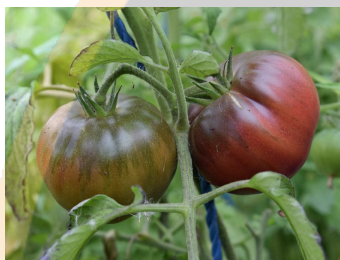


Ultimate Opener - Indeterminate. Firm, blemish free fruits average 30% larger than Early Girl and begin ripening about the same time. The juicy flesh has excellent tomato flavor. Yields are consistently high, with strong disease resistance. **57 DAYS.**

BLUES, BLACKS & PURPLES



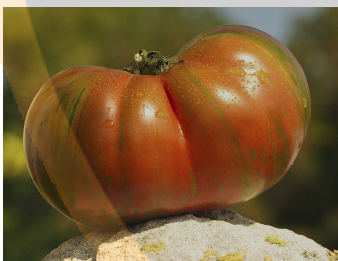
Ananas Noir - Open-Pollinated, Indeterminate. Also known as Black Pineapple, large, dark-purple fruits averaging up to 1 1/2lbs have a distinctive, streaked interior of pink, red, green, and yellow. Green-shouldered fruits deliver a complex hearty tomato taste that's both sweet and rich, with smoky and acidic undertones. Makes a great tomato sauce! **85 DAYS.**



Black Krim - Heirloom, Indeterminate. Medium-size tomatoes in a color range from dark maroon to deep purple or almost black. A hybrid of 'Beefsteak' and 'Cherokee Purple,' fruit matures to about four to six inches in diameter. The tomatoes are named for the Crimean peninsula on the Black Sea ("Krim" in Ukrainian) where they originated. **70-90 DAYS.**



Black Prince - Heirloom, Indeterminate. Unusual brown shoulders become orange-red at the blossom end. Color will be deeper and more pronounced in sunnier locations. Distinctive, rich, fruity tomato flavor. Relatively smooth, 3-5 oz., 3" globes. **74 DAYS.**



Black Zebra - Open-Pollinated, Indeterminate. This deep burgundy tomato has jagged green stripes on the outside and solid mahogany-colored flesh inside. 3-4 oz tomatoes are sweet and juicy, its flavor also carries the rich complexity associated with black tomatoes. **75 DAYS.**

BLUES, BLACKS & PURPLES (cont.)



Cherokee Carbon - Indeterminate. A beautiful, hybrid purple tomato with a rich, complex flavor. A cross between Cherokee Purple and Carbon, this purple beefsteak is the perfect sandwich tomato! **75-80 DAYS.**



Japanese Black Trifele - Heirloom, Indeterminate. This potato leaf tomato has an unusual pear shape and burgundy color. Good yields of 4–6 oz. fruit with excellent, rich flavor. Harvest when shoulders are still green for best flavor. **80-85 DAYS.**



Nyagous - Heirloom, Indeterminate. These black tomatoes appear in clusters of round, smooth fruit that are 6 to 8 ozs. each. Their flavor is excellent, sweet and rich. Production is very good and fruit is reliably blemish-free. **80 DAYS.**



Stripes of Yore - Open-Pollinated, Indeterminate. Plants can get to 4 feet tall in really good soil but plants tend to get to 2.5 feet tall. They have a sweet smooth tomato flavor with fruits getting to 1 inch round. They also make a great snacking tomato and go great in salads and sauce!. **80 DAYS.**

YELLOWS, GREENS & BICOLORS



Azoychka - Heirloom, Indeterminate. This gorgeous, 3-5" round oblate, 6-12 oz, yellow beefsteak. In addition to its earliness and productivity, its impressive delicious flavor is much better than other yellow tomatoes, with a slightly acidic and fruity tang. **65-70 DAYS.**



Dagma's Perfection - Heirloom, Indeterminate.

Matures to a soft shade of pale yellow painted with subtle striping of light red. This 12 oz. slightly flattened fruit has a delicious, rich flavor with nuances of tropical fruit that suits it well to simple salads or slices with only a light drizzle of dressing. **65 DAYS.**



Fred's Tie Dye - Open-Pollinated, Indeterminate. Creamy green flesh infused with various shades of red and yellow stripes. Each of these colors has a different flavor resulting in a spicy, sweet, tart tomato with good acid all in one. Great dwarf plant! **75-80 DAYS.**



Green Berkeley Tie Dye - Open-Pollinated, Indeterminate. Creamy green flesh infused with various shades of red and yellow stripes. Each of these colors has a different flavor resulting in a spicy, sweet, tart tomato with good acid all in one. **75-80 DAYS.**

YELLOWS, GREENS & BICOLORS



Green Tiger - Open-Pollinated, Indeterminate.

Crack-resistant variety produces an abundance of elongated and pointed saladette tomatoes. The uniform, 2" fruits are beautiful, subtly tiger-striped in lime green and yellow, shifting toward peach blush when fully ripe. The well-balanced flavor surprises with notes of pineapple and tropical fruit! **70 DAYS.**

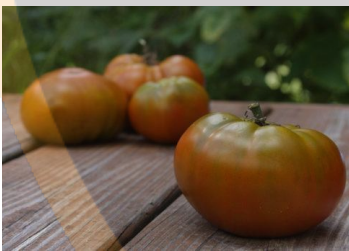


Jaune Flamme - Heirloom, Indeterminate. French for Yellow Flame, these deep orange beauties stack up by the dozen. At 2 inches round and a full, well-balanced flavor of sweet and sour, they're just right for slicing into salads, roasting, drying or cooking into sauce. **75-80 DAYS.**



Pink Berkeley Tie Die - Open-Pollinated,

Indeterminate. This compact plant has a unique appearance with heirloom-quality flavor. 8-12 oz. fruits are dark pink with green striping, and the flesh is pink with yellow streaks. The flavor is outstanding - sweet and complex. **65-75 DAYS.**



Thorburn's Terra Cotta - Heirloom, Indeterminate.

Rich, sweet flavor, great as a slicer or cooked. Copper brown skin, pink flesh, and shimmering green innards. This beautiful heirloom was first introduced in 1893 in full color on the cover of the J.M. Thorburn & Company seed catalog in New York. **75 DAYS.**



Vivacious - Indeterminate. This plant produces high yields of 3" oval orange plum tomatoes that grow in clusters. They are very sweet, juicy and flavorful. Excellent for salads, sandwiches and cooking. **85 DAYS.**

CHERRIES, GRAPES & PEARS



A Grappoli d'Inverno - Heirloom, Indeterminate.

Compact, regular leaf, bushy plant produces huge amounts of red, oval, cherry fruits that can be stored for 4-6 weeks after picking.

Strong acidic flavor, firm flesh and very tasty. **75 DAYS.**



Black Cherry - Heirloom, Indeterminate.

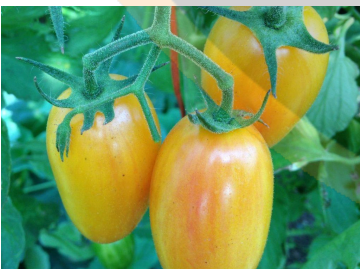
Dusky brown tomatoes have a rich, smoky flavor that blacks are known for.

These large vines have great yields. **75 DAYS.**



Black Opal - Heirloom, Determinate.

This early maturing dark chocolate cherry produces heavy yields of ½ to 1 oz black cherry tomatoes. Tangy and sweet with a firm texture, Black Opal is delicious fresh from the garden or as a paste. **70 DAYS.**



Blush - Heirloom, Indeterminate.

This 2 oz. fruit is marbled in purple, pink, green, and gold. This extremely productive and early variety is an obvious choice. Fantastic tomato taste with a hint of plum and grape. **70 DAYS.**

CHERRIES, GRAPES & PEARS(cont)



Cherry Falls - Determinate. This bush type tomato is perfect for container gardening and large hanging baskets. With a touch of sweetness, these are perfect for salads and snacking. **60-75 DAYS**



Chocolate Cherry - Heirloom, Indeterminate. This variety produces fruits in a beautiful shade of brick red, or brown. The word chocolate in the name indicates the chocolaty brown shading on the fruit. The fruit growing on this plant is not only tasty but also crack resistant. **70 DAYS.**

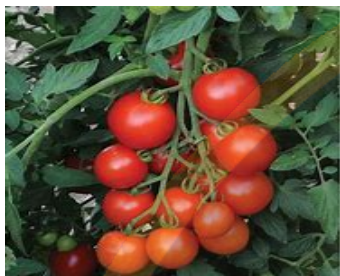


Fantastico - Determinate. A unique bush tomato with well-flavored half-ounce grape shaped fruit. High yielding plants produce up to 12 pounds of ripe fruit. Best grown in a cage to provide some plant support, but can also be grown in a large patio container or an 18-inch hanging basket. **50 DAYS.**



Isis Candy - Heirloom, Indeterminate. Gorgeous bicolor cherry tomatoes are red with a spectacular cat's eye starburst on the blossom end. Rich, sweet, fruity flavor. Plants are loaded with 1½" fruits in clusters of 6-8. **75 DAYS.**

CHERRIES, GRAPES & PEARS(cont)



Lizzano - Semi-Determinate. This vigorous tomato variety has a low-growing, trailing habit excellent for growing in patio containers or hanging baskets. In the garden, some staking will benefit this plant despite a nice compact and uniform growth habit. The durable, appealing plants grow 16 to 20 inches tall with a compact spread of only 20 inches. **65 DAYS.**



Midnight Snack - Indeterminate. A unique indigo-type cherry tomato that ripens to red with a beautiful glossy black-purple overlay when exposed to sunlight. Vines should be staked and, lucky for us gardeners, plentiful fruits will ripen all season long! **65-70 DAYS.**



Mountain Magic - Open-Pollinated, Indeterminate. High yields of 2 oz., bright red, round salad tomatoes with very sweet flavor. The uniform, crack-resistant fruits may be truss harvested. Great in salads or right off the vine. **66 DAYS.**



Patio Choice Yellow - Determinate. A compact tomato developed specifically for small spaces and container gardens. Produces very large yields of 1/2 oz., bright yellow cherry tomatoes on short vines that grow only 18 inches tall. This mild-flavored cherry tomato sets over 100 fruit on compact plants that are perfect for small space food gardeners. **65 DAYS.**

CHERRIES, GRAPES & PEARS(cont)



Pear Drops Yellow - Heirloom, Indeterminate.

Semi-trailing, cascading branches, makes this variety ideal for growing in hanging baskets. Tiers of beautiful golden-yellow, bite-sized fruit tumble over a mounded habit.

Pink Ping Pong - Heirloom, Indeterminate. Compact, bushy plants produce amazing yields of sweet, pink fruits the size of ping pong balls, 1-3 oz., tomatoes that are juicy and bursting with amazing flavors. Great for salads, canning or snacking. **75 DAYS.**



Sun Gold - Indeterminate. One of our most popular, a fruity or tropical flavor is a big hit with everyone who tastes it. The bright apricot-orange round globes are 1 ¼ inches across and are borne on long, 10-15 fruit, grape-like clusters. **65 DAYS.**



Sun Sugar - Indeterminate. Attractive, golden-yellow color and an extraordinary sugar-sweet flavor make this one perfect gourmet cherry tomato! Thin-skinned, tiny, crack-resistant fruits.

CHERRIES, GRAPES & PEARS(cont)



Sunrise Bumblebee - Indeterminate. A beautiful orange-yellow, 1 1/2" cherry with red stripes and pink flesh with an excellent sweet, yet tangy flavor. Vigorous vines produce continuously over a long growing season. **70 DAYS.**



Super Sweet 100 - Indeterminate. Cherry tomatoes bursting with sugary flavor. The scarlet, cherry-sized fruits are produced in long pendulous clusters right up to frost. Grow on stakes or a fence. **62 DAYS.**



Sweet Million - Open-Pollinated, Indeterminate. Sweet, cherry-sized tomatoes all season long with this highly productive variety. Sugary sweet, round, 1/2 in. fruits set in grapelike clusters. Excellent for fresh eating, salads, pickling and preserves. **65 DAYS.**



Tiny Temptations - Open-Pollinated, Determinate. Dwarf, bushy plants have a mounding/trailing habit, growing up to 16" tall and spreading up to 14". **70-85 DAYS.**



Unicorn - Indeterminate. Brilliant red, cocktail cherries pack the large-tomato flavor you've been seeking into a bite-sized, crack-resistant punch. Ideal for snacking and salads. **76 DAYS.**

ROMAS, PLUMS & PASTES



Amish Gold - Indeterminate. Plants that yield huge crops of 1 1/2"-2" oblong shaped, gorgeous golden tomatoes with a sharply-pointed end. Fruit has the gold color and flavor of the Sungold, the meatiness of the Amish Paste and delicious sweet/tart tomato flavor. **80 DAYS.**



Amish Paste - Open-Pollinated, Indeterminate. This vigorous plant grows 4-5 ft. tall and produces plenty of 8-12 oz., bright red, juicy fruits with meaty flesh. While a favorite for cooking into sauces, this Roma tomato type is good for using in salads and salsas too. **80 DAYS.**



Black Plum - Indeterminate. A very prolific Russian strain, whose brownish-gray fruits are so sweet and meaty that some prefer Black Plum to Roma for making sauces. Also excellent when used in salads or for drying. Oval fruits average 2 to 4 oz., and turn a deep mahogany-brown color at maturity. **80 DAYS.**



Mini Roma - Indeterminate. Typically grow to a height of 2-4 ft, making them suitable for small gardens or container planting. Excellent for sauces, pastes and cooking. **70 DAYS.**



Orange Banana - Heirloom, Indeterminate. Sprawling plants produce good yields of 3", 2-3 oz. plum-shaped orange paste with pointed ends and a good sweet-tart flavor. Although a paste tomato, the taste is so good that aside from delicious sauces and salsa, it is also perfect for eating fresh or canning and drying. **85 DAYS.**

ROMAS, PLUMS & PASTES (cont)



Plum Lemon - Heirloom, Indeterminate. This plant produces heavy yields of 4-6 oz bright yellow tomatoes. It resembles the size and color of a lemon. They are very meaty and flavorful with a unique citrus flavor. Perfect for salads, tomato sauce, yellow ketchup, and more. **80 DAYS.**



Porter's Pride - Heirloom, Indeterminate. Yields 2-3-inch, 3 oz., meaty, firm, very flavorful red tomatoes. 6 fruits per cluster on a long stem. Good choice for a container or patio garden. This tomato is a very good canning and salad tomato. **69 DAYS.**



Principe Borghese - Heirloom, Determinate. Famous for sun drying. Small 1-2 oz., grape-shaped fruit is very dry and has few seeds. It has a rich tomato taste that is wonderful for sauces. Vines yield clusters of fruit in abundance. **70-75 DAYS.**



San Marzano - Heirloom, Indeterminate. This one still ranks among the richest roma types out there. It is high in sugars, pectin, and flavor for the very best in sauces, pastes, and soups. The rosy red fruit are meaty and thick walled, reaching up to 5 inches long. **85 DAYS.**



Yaqui - Determinate. An extremely vigorous, compact plant that sets a tremendous amount of blocky plum tomatoes. Extra-large fruit perfect for canning or for cooking into delicious sauce or paste. **75 DAYS.**
